3. **Ian Livingstone – Centrica Storage**  
Ian and Paul outlined a planning application to facilitate a £25million pound investment in the York onshore Compression Project. The application was to be submitted to ERYC and the Parish Council should receive this for consultation shortly. The highest structure at the terminal is 20m high, work will commence April 2016 and will be completed Dec 2016, there will be an extra 100 personnel throughout the summer. There will be some additional noise but this will be within the permitted levels. Councillors mentioned additional traffic and the added speeds of some of these vehicles, Centrica advised that this would be monitored and asked that if anyone can provide registration numbers then, if proved to be terminal personnel then they would be dealt with according to Centrica policy.

4. **Public Forum**

Robina raised the lack of salt along Seaside Road and how icy it had been on occasions recently. A gentleman raised that he didn't feel the angling community had been heard throughout the YWT visitor centre talk, he indicated that during fishing competitions many anglers visit the area and felt there was a need to reinstate the road to Spurn. Mally Douglas outlined proposals to "get rid" of one fire engine from Withernsea which would leave our parish very vulnerable, he urged locals to strongly object to this and ensure their views and concerns are heard.
