SPURN BIRD OBSERVATORY

We've got a busy year ahead at Spurn Bird Observatory with improvements to our newly acquired Sykes Field (this was Blue Bell Pond caravan site), ready for the spring taking up prime importance. Trees and bushes have been planted, areas demarcated for sowing with wildflowers in the spring and general waste wood and paraphernalia removed to make this site into a real wildlife haven. Access to this land is for members of Friends of Spurn so why not join in 2020 and help support us and our work to create and manage wildlife habitat, and monitor migrant birds, in the Spurn area.

YORKSHIRE WILDLIFE TRUST

We have had a busy and interesting time since the start of the Spurn Young Ranger Scheme this November. Following the themes of the John Muir Award we started off with a cycle ride to explore the far reaches of Spurn Point, using maps to pinpoint our location as we went, visiting the lighthouse and touching the sea at the most southern point. Over the weeks our exploration continued, seeing the way the beach changed after some high tides and witnessing the power of the waves and an amazing amount of sea foam on a very stormy day!

We visited the Lifeboat Station with Red Watch, learning about what it's like to be a Lifeboat volunteer and got to try on the waterproof uniform (very heavy), finally discovered the location of the Potato Fields and found a whole fox skeleton. The teeth were worn and broken so we suspect it was quite old. Any regulars to Spurn would know there are large numbers of birds that gather in the autumn and swirl and swoop together in great numbers, a breath-taking sight. We are starting to identify some plants, it seems many of them start with the word sea.....!

Our conservation work programme has included a beach clean - we found and cleared away many bags full of plastic also locating a fox den on our travels. We have cleaned the hide on Canal Scrape and spent a day with Spurn Bird Observatory bramble bashing to improve the range of habitats and help the trees to grow on one of their sites, getting well fed with hot bacon and egg cobs too. We have also planted some trees by the car park and still have quite a few more to put in.

We have shared what we have been doing with regular posts on Facebook, took some Go-Pro footage and made posters encouraging others to use less plastic or to join us as Young Rangers. We still have spaces, it is open to anyone aged between 11 and 18, we meet every Saturday from 10-3 and it's free to come. Call the Spurn Discovery Centre on 01964 650 144 if interested.
