SPURN BIRD OBSERVATORY

I am delighted to be able to inform you that after a long and challenging search for an Observatory Manager at Spurn, Rob Hunton who was the Assistant Warden has now been appointed to the role. The interview process was both thorough and challenging but Rob was able to clearly demonstrate that he has both the ability and commitment to fulfil this very demanding role. I hope that you will all support him and wish him well as he takes our observatory to the next level of performance. Rob Adams Chairman of Spurn Bird Observatory.

We had a couple of really exciting migration events in the Autumn. The UK's smallest bird a Goldcrest, with an average weight of 5 grams, was picked up on the Motus Wildlife Tracking System installed at the Observatory, after it had been fitted with a 'nanotag' in The Netherlands the previous day. It made the crossing in less than 8 hours. Thats an average of 44km per hour! We then had 2 Blackbirds make the exact same crossing, and one of those averaged a whopping 77km per hour, presumably taking advantage of the north easterly wind that day!

The music quiz in the Crown and Anchor was another successful evening, with £300 raised for Dove House Hospice in Hull, and the Bird Observatory. If anybody is interested to learn about the work we do at the observatory, or get involved in any of the projects we are involved in, please get in touch with Rob at Kew Villa."
